- We train speech-language pathologists/therapists to lead Hanen Programs[®] around the world

- We train early childhood educators to create enriched, responsive language learning environments for all children, including those with identified language delays


- We develop outstanding, user-friendly materials for parents and professionals that break down the latest research into practical, usable strategies

Increasing the accessibility of our trainings and resources to parents and professionals around the world


Hanen offers a variety of professional development workshops for speech-language pathologists and early childhood professionals who work with young children and their families. These trainings provide an evidence-based, easy-to-use framework for supporting and coaching parents and educators to effectively promote early social, language and literacy skills.

Workshops Around the World

In 2014, 1,368 professionals became Hanen certified by taking one of three entry-level Hanen workshops: <u>It Takes Two to Talk®</u>, <u>More</u> <u>Than Words®</u> and <u>Learning Language and</u> <u>Loving It™</u>. Once certified, these professionals joined the growing community of Hanen Members around the world and received special <u>member benefits</u>.

Hanen workshops took place in a greater number of countries in 2014 than any previous year. A total of 153 certification workshops were offered in 21 countries.

Hanen also offers three Advanced Workshops
to existing Hanen members looking for more
professional development: <u>TalkAbility™</u>, <u>Target</u>
<u>Word™</u> and <u>ABC and Beyond™</u>. In 2014, 26
Advanced Workshops were offered to 350 Hanen
members around the world.



Expansion of our New Training for Early Interventionists

In 2014, SPARK Communication[™] was re-branded and revised to include the most recent research on coaching families – a key element of the training. SPARK offerings grew significantly in 2014, expanding beyond North America to Scotland, Denmark and Australia, and training a total 152 early intervention providers.

SPARK Communication[™]: Coaching Parents to Use Hanen Strategies is a new Hanen training designed specifically for early intervention professionals who work with young children with language delays and their families. Participants learn research-based responsive interaction strategies that are known to accelerate children's early language development, and they learn how to coach parents to apply these strategies during everyday interactions with their child.







Expansion of Member Benefits

In 2014, we rolled out a new member benefit; Online Member Meetings. These interactive meetings:

- connect our members with Hanen Program Directors to offer extra clinical support and valuable information
- connect our members with each other so they can share case studies and discuss how they're applying Hanen content in their day-to-day work with families

8 Online Member Meetings were offered in 2014 to a total of 819 members.

When professionals attend a Hanen Certification Workshop, they receive a one-year renewable <u>Hanen membership</u>, entitling them to exclusive benefits, such as a member newsletter with frequent research updates, significant discounts on online trainings, and ongoing clinical support.



New research

The Hanen Centre participates in leading-edge research in our field to ensure that our programs are evidence-based.

In 2014, an important study was concluded on <u>ABC and Beyond[™] – The Hanen Program®</u> for Building Emergent Literacy in Early Childhood <u>Settings</u>.

The aim of the study: To assess the value of a key element of the ABC and Beyond Program: video-feedback coaching.

Who conducted it: Dr. Luigi Girolametto, Professor at University of Toronto's

Department of Speech Pathology, along with co-investigators, Janice Greenberg, Hanen's Director of Early Childhood Education Services, Elaine Weitzman, Hanen's Executive Director, and other researchers from the University of Toronto.

What it involved: One group of early childhood educators received the traditional ABC and Beyond program that includes group training sessions and individualized

video-feedback sessions while the other group received only the group training sessions and no video-feedback sessions.

What it showed: Results revealed that the educators in the coached group gained additional skills compared to those who received only group training sessions. They encouraged longer conversations

with the children, used specific skills (e.g. vocabulary teaching) at a higher frequency, and were better able to fine-tune strategies to engage a larger number of children in shared reading conversations. Children taught by the coached group used longer, more complex sentences than the comparison group.





Following a successful 2014 year, we're looking forward to a number of new projects and developments, including:



Booklet 3 in the <u>Make Play R.O.C.K.™</u> **booklet series** – Put Pretending into Your Child's Play offers practical strategies for building more advanced pretend play skills in children with autism.



Online tutorials - We're excited to launch a series of interactive online learning sessions for parents and educators who work with young children. With the goal of providing easy access to key information and strategies, these tutorials may be used as a supplement or as an alternative to the guidebooks to help parents and educators promote children's communication during everyday interactions and conversations.



More Than Words program update - In 2014, the More Than Words program was revised to include the most recent research on play and its relationship to communication in young children with autism. The updated program is being piloted throughout 2015 and will be made available to More Than Words-certified speech-language pathologists in 2016.



Target Word program update – In response to new research on the importance of gesture use in building vocabulary in Late Takers, we are revising the Target Word Program and accompanying materials. The updated program will be made available in late 2015.
